Spring has sprung ... early! I haven't heard too many complaints about that, but I have heard some

concerns about frost (or snow) after bushes and trees have budded and even bloomed. Also, the warm early spring and low snowfall resulted in drier than usual trails for this time of year, but that could change with a few major spring showers! In the meantime, be sure to heed the burn ban and avoid all "mud season" trails. Check trail conditions with DEC or ADK before heading to the High Peaks in the spring. As I write this in early April, we've already

seen a few spring wildflowers. You should get out earlier than usual to see those flowers that we're treated to for a short window of time. If you don't get a chance to see them in person, come to our May Program with the Southern Adirondack Audubon Society for a program on Adirondack Flora and Fauna.

Our May program is the last program until September as experience has shown us that few ADKers like to come inside when the weather gets warmer and the days longer. Speaking of longer, on June 19th, we are once again planning a Longest Day event (actually the day before the Longest Day). We did this last year and we've been asked to do it again. This year, we will once again offer a paddle on the west shore of Lake George and a hike up Prospect in the

late afternoon to early evening. The plan is to finish by 7ish and meet up in the Village of Lake George for a

picnic dinner or take out. Bring something to share if you'd like. See the outings schedule to sign up for an outing or just come to Shepards Park and join us at 7:30. We'll be at the picnic tables on the lake side of the bandstand. We had a beautiful evening last year and hopefully we will again this year. Rain date: Wednesday, June 20th

Executive Committee Meeting Minutes Synopsis

Minutes from February 1, 2012

Treasurer John Schneider presented the January 2012 Treasurer's Report where assets were \$5,268, down \$1,105 from the prior month.

Chapter Chair Mo Coutant reported that Heidi teRiele Karkoski resigned as Chair of the Annual Dinner Committee. Heidi remains on the Executive Committee, as Immediate Past Chair.

It was discussed that **Firetower Challenge** ("FTC") completers are only required to complete the checklist and submit \$3.00 for the patch; a descriptive letter is optional.

It was unanimously agreed to ask Chapter member Bob Aspholm, who designed the Chapter patch, if he could paint a decorative Adirondack chair, which the Chapter could then donate to the Club's **Black Fly Affair** fundraiser, instead of the usual basket, and he is willing to do this.

Nominating Committee Chair Laura Fiske reported that she anticipates one Director slot and one Vice-chair slot being open this year.

Wilderness Committee Chair Jim Schneider reported that there was minimal damage from Hurricane Irene. He is working with the Club Publications Committee on updating the Firetower Challenge book.

Hospitality Chair Gretchen Steen requested that programs be limited to one hour and that she be able to discuss the gas fracking issue at future programs.

Younger Members Group Chair Jonathan Lane discussed a goal of adding more YMG outings leaders, creating a YouTube channel (the Club has one now), and adding games to the website.

John Schneider reported that he is planning the 2013 **Winter Camp** outing.

Chapter Chair Mo Coutant discussed her interest in doing more joint programs with Southern Adirondack Audubon. She said that the Chapter had received a thank you letter from Club President Jim Bird for the Chapter's \$3,000 donation to the Club in 2011.

For those of you wishing to hike the recently opened Loon Lake Mt Tower to your list of accomplishments but are having a difficult time finding directions here's some guidance that should get you there.

Head North on Route 3 out of Saranac Lake past Vermontville, after several miles take a left onto County Rt 26/Old Route 99 (it may also show on maps as Port Kent-Hopkinton Turnpike). Continue towards Loon Lake(s). Go past Loon Lake(s) and you will come to a DEC sign and parking area for Grass Pond on the right side of the road. Less than 500 feet on the left you will notice a gate barring access to a dirt road. There isn't much room to park there so it is probably best to park at Grass Pond parking area. When I was there in mid February, the only sign was a yellow DEC Trail Marker on a post next to the gate. This is the access to the trail where the DEC has a small sign about 3/4 mile up the dirt road directing you to the tower. Sorry I can't provide mileage markers as it took me few trips up and down the road before I was able to locate the trail. Enjoy and if anyone has up to date info on signs and/or mileage let us know. Thanks!

For those not experienced in strenuous trips, it is best to begin with something easier and work your way up. The Leader will assist in evaluating skill level and suggest alternative outings if more appropriate. For the safety and comfort of all, the Leader has the discretion to deny participation if he/she feels someone is not a good match for that trip. Based on the expectations and skills of the entire group, Leaders may have more flexibility for some trips, so definitely talk with them. DO NOT TRY STRENUOUS OUTINGS UNLESS YOU HAVE DONE THAT ACTIVITY REGULARLY (and recently and are in good shape as necessary for that outing. *ADK Liability Waiver must be provided by Leader and signed by all participants before the trip begins. This is a requirement by ADK HQ. Parents must sign for minors. *No Pets allowed on outings except where designated in the description.

Hiking Needs/Preparation/Equipment

Bring Trail Food and plenty of Water on ALL hikes! *Clothing made of Polyester blends, polarguard or wool are recommended as they retain warmth even when wet. — NOT 100% Cotton clothing! It is also wise to ring raingear. Other pack essentials: compass and map, headlamp/ flashlight, first aid kit, hat, gloves, and extra socks. Adirondack weather can and does change suddenly. Don't trust the forecast or the sky based on the start of the day. Be prepared!

In addition to the preparation/equipment mentioned above, winter requires some EXTRA planning. Look for special notes in the Outing description and discuss with the Leader. Depending on conditions, articipants will can expect to bring Snow Shoes and Crampons. Bring lots of Water. Dehydration comes easier in the winter and we feel its effects later ... usually AFTER the fact. Be wise with Emergency Clothing. Bring an extra wool/polypro hat, mittens and socks. Vented • \Shell. pants, jackets and mittens are commonly used with warm layers beneath.
