# Forest Pests and the Potential Impact on the Adirondacks March 24, 2021 Zoom, 7 pm

Tammara Van Ryn is a long-time member of the Glens Falls-Saratoga ADK Chapter and currently is the Program Manager for the Adirondack Park Invasive Plant Program (APIPP). The Nature Conservancy hosts APIPP, which is funded by the NY Environmental Protection Fund as administered by NYSDEC. In the manager role Tammara is overseeing the Adirondack response to two new recent forest pests that have the potential to dramatically alter the Adirondack landscape. Join Tammara for a fascinating discussion of forest pests, climate change, and how you can help identify and report invasive species.



In 2020 Tammara moved from the Saratoga area to Saranac Lake to work for The Nature Conservancy. She has paddled and hiked many corners of the Adirondacks.

But really, if you want to get outdoors for a few hours, this is also the hike for you! The plan is to leisurely trek around the lake, and maybe over if it's frozen. We can take the trail up to the overlook if there's interest and loop back around to the warming hut. Provided it's open, we'll pop inside to warm up and have

some cocoa and snacks before wrapping up. Pack your own hot beverage of choice. I'll bring individually wrapped treats to share but feel free to bring your own.
