"Geology of the Adirondacks, Saratoga County and Beyond" Wednesday, November 15th 7pm Saratoga Springs Public Library

Drake McDonough has a passion for rock, particularly our local rock! He will discuss the unique geology of the southeast Adirondacks, including the metamorphic history of the Adirondack bedrock, the Saratoga-McGregor fault and how it shaped the topography of the Palmertown Ridge. He will also discuss the deglacial history of the Hudson River and how it came to occupy the gorge through Moreau State Park. You may discover the Adirondack bedrock extends much farther south than the official boundaries let on.

Drake McDonough has long been fascinated by the unique geology of the southeast



Adirondacks and Saratoga Springs. Growing up in Ballston Spa and graduating with a degree in geology from Union College, this area shaped much of Drake's formative lessons in natural history. Drake became focused on researching the Palmertown Range for Saratoga PLAN in 2022, creating interpretive materials to support their conservation goals in the area. Much of his research details the impressive natural history alongside the history of how people came to understand and use the mineral wealth for industry and science. Drake is now a Stewardship Assistant at the Agricultural Stewardship Association, where he works to ensure the ongoing conservation of working lands in Washington and Rensselaer counties.

Summer Camp 2024 - Application deadline Jan 31, 2024

Adventure, Education, & Fun!

Lessons at camp cover a range of topics led by counselors with backgrounds in science, education, or recreation and include examining insects and flowers in a field, using nets along the lake shore to study macroinvertebrates, or venturing in the forest to learn about biodiversity and forestry. Throughout the week campers engage in activities that emphasize basic ecological concepts about habitats, species identification, and how organisms and habitats adapt to changes. Campers also consider environmental solutions through activities and scenarios that encourage them to make decisions to mitigate their impacts on the environment. The Glens Falls-Saratoga Chapter of the Adirondack Mountain Club pays the \$350 fee for the selected youths (ages 11 to 17) to spend a week at either of the DEC's environmental camps, Camp Colby near Saranac Lake or Pack Forest just above Warrensburg.

For those in the older range who prefer a more rugged experience, which includes five days out in the woods with hands-on experience learning the ins and outs of trail maintenance, ADK offers its own **ADK Teen Trail program**. The chapter pays the \$350 fee for the Teen Trails program. Applicants of Teen Trails will have a choice of several possible locations, which in the past included the High Peaks area, portions of the Northville-Placid Trail and others. PEAKED HILLS BUSHWHACK IN HOFFMAN NOTCH WILDERNESS

- We'll park at the Dirgylot Hill parking area on the left off
of Route 9, a few miles north of Schroon Lake and Northway Exit 28. From there, we'll hike under the Northway culvert, following the old woods road to the first tee, turning right, and then following the woods road a short distance and continuing along a very light hunter's trail leading to the north with evidence of old hatchet marks on trees, even-tually hitting the major unnamed drainage on the east side of Blue Ridge (17th Brook), where another old woods road parallels the brook. We may take a direct approach directly up East Peaked Hill that offers some nice views back to Pharaoh Mountain, or follow 17th Brook to the northern base of East Peaked Hill and climb to its summit to admire the views, and then continue to South Peaked Hill and perhaps continue over to West Peaked Hill nearest Hoffman Mountain for the Peaked Hills trifecta.
